Library Committee

2017-18 Annual Report

The Faculty Senate Library Committee (FSLC) convened four times in 2017-18. The first meeting was held in and included a tour of the Valley Library following the recommendation of the 2016-2017 FSLC; the remaining three meetings were held in 109 Gilkey Hall. The standing mandate of the FSLC is related to maintaining open lines of communication between OSU Libraries (OSUL) and the faculty, students, and staff. This year the FSLC was given the additional task to evaluate the functioning of the committee and provide any recommendations on the FSLC's mandate to the Faculty Senate. The report, which was submitted to the Faculty Senate president Jon Dorbolo, is provided as an addendum to this Annual Report. The evaluation process was the primary focus of the 2017-18 FSLC. Apart from this effort the FSLC maintained a holding pattern in regard to its primary mandate through open conversations with OSUL staff on topics related to the OSUL policies, budget, and the OSUL strategic planning process. A member of the FSLC also served on the selection committee for the Library's Undergraduate Research Awards, and the FSLC continued to purse reinstatement of the Library Research Travel Grant program (refer to the 2016-2017 annual report for details).

The following set of recommendations for the 2018-2019 FSLC build on those established in 2016-2017:

- 1) Recruit student members early in the Fall term.
- 2) Systematize the scheduling of meetings.
- 3) Conduct a tour of the Valley Library for FSLC members in the Fall.
- 4) Consider organizing a colloquium or public seminar on topics relevant to OSUL, as per the recommendation given in the FSLC self-study (see addendum to this Annual Report).

Moving Forward

Members of the FSLC discussed critically the need for the continuation of this committee as part of the governance of OSU. We conclude that, while the involvement of the committee varied over the years, its existence is justified as it provides the Library and the Faculty at OSU with a fluid communication venue as well as a sounding board for ideas. The Valley

Library at OSU continues to change in the ways it provides its services to faculty, students and the citizens of Oregon in an always challenging funding environment and adapting to new technological methods for publication and education. The FSLC continues to serve as the most direct nexus between the Administration of OSUL with the most representative government body of the faculty, its faculty senate. A survey reaffirms the value of the FSLC as 12 out of 17 of our peer institutions have similar committees in existence.

The FSLC also discussed the value in refining the functioning of the committee in a few key ways:

- 1. instituting a standard set of topics that will regularly be addressed by the FSLC, in particular identifying budget concerns and providing a sounding board for collection management decisions,
- 2. formalizing a communication pathway between the FSLC with other faculty, e.g., routing feedback given to the Library by outside faculty through the FSLC, and
- 3. establishing goals for the next academic year at the end of the current academic year as a way to strengthen its visibility and serve better the constituents of the FSLC.

In order to address the above points, we propose that the 2018/19 FSLC work with OSUL to organize a public seminar (given by a high profile speaker(s)) that addresses the everincreasing costs of professional journals. If successful, this event could be a recurring effort led by the FSLC with topics that alternate on a yearly basis. For example, another potential focus area discussed by the FSLC was the changing role of the Library in providing academic spaces and facilities for student support. A seminar series with external speakers would serve to i) highlight the changing mission and pressing concerns of the OSUL and academic libraries more generally, ii) foster communication between the OSUL, FSLC, and other faculty, and iii) enhance support for the OSU Libraries.
