Note that there has already been much discussion of the elements of the structure, including substantial feedback from the "Roadshow" forums, where we met with well over 700 campus and external stakeholders. The Reform Committee also presented the final model and collected feedback for consideration at the May 12, 2022, Faculty Senate meeting and the May 20, 2022, Faculty Senate Special Session. Additionally, the Senate began this process by hosting the 2019 listening sessions and administering the 2019 student survey.
