Proposal Regarding Residence Requirement for Ph.D. – Updating

Residence

For the doctoral degree, the residence requirement consists of two parts: 1. a minimum of 36 graduate Oregon State University credits must be completed; and 2. Full-time the students must spend at least three terms of full-time graduate academic work (at least 9 credits per term) on campus or at an off-campus site approved by the Graduate School. Part-time students must expend a minimum of three terms of commensurate effort to ensure academic engagement with their graduate committee.

The latter second requirement of three terms of full-time enrollment does not have to take place in consecutive terms. Adequate fulfillment of the residence requirement shall be determined by the Graduate School. *Programs may elect to waive this requirement at the program-level through communication with the Graduate School. Programs are responsible for communicating this policy to their students at the time of matriculation.*

Alternatively, the policy would be rewritten to simply state:

For the doctoral degree, the residency requirement is a minimum of 36 graduate Oregon State University credits must be completed.

(Thus, entirely removing language associated with full/part-time and credit enrollment/term.)

The Graduate School policies will be updated as follows:

Residence

For the doctoral degree, the residence requirement consists of two parts:

- 1. A minimum of 36 graduate Oregon State University credits must be completed; and
- The student must spend at least three terms of full-time graduate academic work (at least 9 credits per term) on campus or at an off-campus site approved by the Graduate School. The requirement of three terms of fulltime enrollment does not have to take place in consecutive terms. Graduate programs may formally opt out of full-time and/or location requirements if they can otherwise demonstrate adequate doctoral community engagement

and time-to-degree expectations. Any degree-specific requirements, as described in the degree program's student handbook, that may relate to enrollment requirements, residency requirements, or other non-curricular requirements.

Adequate fulfillment of the residence requirement shall be determined by the Graduate School.
