#### Where have we been?

- Faculty Senate Presidents Bob Mason & Jon Dorbolo requested AOT investigate the landscape of OSU's eSETs (late 2017/early 2018)
- During 2018, AOT finds OSU's eSETs unable to meet their intended need (reports Mar. & Dec. 2018)
- Senate floor (Mar. 2019) discussion suggests immediate investigation of OSU's eSETs to FS Executive Committee for consideration of elimination or replacement, EC refers to AOT

# Charge & Intended Outcomes

Charge: Have an institutional wide conversation about Quality Teaching at OSU and the ways in which we identify it and continually work towards it.

Outcomes: The intended outcomes were to:

- 1) Reach accord on what is "Quality Teaching" at OSU
- 2) Propose implementable recommendations for:

Student experience feedback (in term & end of term) (formerly, eSETs)

**Faculty self-reflection** 

Teaching dossier/portfolio


Teaching peer review

#### What did we do?

In Spring 2019, we recruited broadly for a group to review

OSU's Teaching Evaluation materials

• OTER, ~80 participants





#### What did we do?

# The Beaver. The Otter.

#### OTER group met three times to:

- Articulate Quality Teaching Framework
- Examine & Discuss:
  - eSETs (2 groups)
  - Teaching self-reflection (1 group)
  - Teaching Portfolios (2 groups)
  - Peer Review of Teaching (2 groups)

#### **Products:**

- Quality Teaching Framework
  - Principles of effective instruction
- Subcommittee reports
  - eSET: Student voice needs to be meaningful for students, faculty, and admin; change it now!
  - Self-Reflection: Needed and should be incorporated into all evaluation methods
  - Teaching Portfolio: Recommended for TT and NTT
  - Peer Review: Highly variable across units; needs to be transparent.

#### Recommendations:

- Initiate a formal process of discussing, revising, and adopting the Quality Teaching Framework across OSU by the end of AY 2019-2020;
- Select a new model to collect data about Student Learning Experiences, aligned to the Quality Teaching Framework, by the end of AY 2019-2020; this work includes initiating a working collaboration between AOT and the FS Promotion and Tenure Committee during the Student Learning Experience tool pilot.
- 3. Explore the implications and processes needed to require Teaching Portfolios university-wide for all those with teaching FTE.
- 4. Task a working group to examine current OSU practices in Peer Review of Teaching to evaluate the need for revision, making specific recommendations for action (if needed).

# PROCESS: Next Steps and Action Items

**Phase I** Gather data from departments on summative and formative assessment purposes, practices, and uses

**Phase II** Gather data from other institutions on summative and formative assessment purposes, practices, uses, and processes of change

**Phase III** Recommend changes for instructors and students that allows useful feedback to inform instruction

**Phase IV** Pilot changes; collect & analyze data

#### Plans for AY 2019-2020

- Discuss Quality Teaching Framework:
  - With College leadership (Deans & College P&T committees)
  - With community
    - After revisions, seek formal adoption
- Pilot revised Student Learning Experience (SLE) models (formative/mid-term feedback and end-of-term feedback)
- Solicit pilot feedback from participating faculty/departments; analyze and communicate findings to FS and college/university leadership
- With FS P&T Committee, develop policy and procedure for utilizing SLE data
