Recap: OSU Teaching Evaluation Revision (OTER)

- Spring 2019
- 70 faculty (tenure track, non-tenure track, advisors, administrators)
- 17 academic units
- 4 primary methods of evaluating instruction at OSU

4 Primary Methods of Teaching Evaluation

1. Student Feedback
2. Peer Evaluation
3. Self-Reflection
4. Teaching Portfolios

Quality Teaching (QT) Framework

- Set of guiding principles to inform instruction and teaching evaluation
- Focused on goals for teaching to provide direction for teaching evaluation tools and approaches
- NOT a checklist to evaluate teaching session or individual faculty member
- Colleges and units determine how to implement evaluation based on principles.

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QT Framework: So what?

- The Framework is a blueprint to help us **build a strong culture of teaching.**
- Basis for changes to teaching evaluation practices
- Aligns OSU evaluation of teaching to research-based practices

Engagement to Adoption: Tentative Timeline

- Final working draft to be presented to Faculty Senate for discussion
April 2020
- Vote for adoption May 2020 meeting
- Collaboration with Promotion and Tenure Committee

From eSET to Student Learning Experience (SLE)

AOT and OTER reviewed several models

- Formative and End-of-Term instruments

For spring 2020 pilot, 2 approaches:

- Question bank (research-based question set from Ohio State, UO)
- Research-validated instrument (SEEQ, from USC)
- (Possible proprietary model for fall 2020: IDEA/Campus Labs—also a validated instrument)
- Links to models to be added to FS/AOT site for reference

SLE Pilot

Spring 2020

- Content, usability
- Debrief during summer and fall; solicit content suggestions
- Student engagement

Fall 2020

- Content refinement, Interface/Format, Timing of survey administration
- Ongoing feedback
- Ongoing student engagement

AY 2020-2021

- Evaluation and Policy/Practice Implications
- Collaboration with P&T and Discussion with Faculty Senate
