- Discussion needed
 - ES 360 Cultural Diversity
 - There is no connections made to the material and not enough information on assessment.
 - The answers on the form have more detail, but this is not clear on the syllabus.
 - Send back with request for revisions use responses on forms to flesh out the syllabus.
 - AAE 413 and AAE 415 Science, Tech and Society
 - Neither syllabus mentions the Baccalaureate Core (BC) learning outcomes nor how they are assessed.
 - The syllabi are virtually the same in the way the BC is addressed, though AAE 415 does make one mention of the BC.
 - There are four enforced pre-requisites. The pre-requisites also have pre-requisites, bringing the total of pre-requisites for this course to nine. This course is not accessible to the general student body.
 - There is no explanation on how the course intends to meet the BC requirements.
 - They are no details provided on the writing assignment so it is difficult to determine that it meets the requirements.
 - The only tie to 'Society' is a brief mention of discussing government regulations.
 - Do not approve all pre-requisites must be removed and heavy editing is required. The committee is concerned that the course could not be adequately taught without the pre-requisites. The course may not be suitable for the BC.
 - ART 371 Science, Tech and Society

- The syllabus is missing some information and needs quite a bit of development.
- There are no connections to the BC learning outcomes and no information on how they are assessed.
- The course does not meet outcome 1 there are no links to historical or political perspectives. Some of the readings may touch on these in more detail, but these readings are not required.
 - Send back learning outcome 1 needs significant revision.
 Recommend reaching out to Heath for assistance

Old Business

- Dual Representation Policy update
 - Catalog edit language currently in the catalog. It must be approved by the Faculty Senate by mid-May so Belinda can publish the catalog June 1.
 - Drafted language was presented
 - The committee moved to vote, seconded; approved with no abstentions.
- Revisit Courses not taught in 3 years conversation
 - Will the committee decide to remove these courses from the Baccalaureate Core catalog list?
 - The committee moved to remove the BC designator from courses not taught 2017 or before; seconded; approved with no abstentions.
 - The committee recommends removing these courses from the catalog entirely.
 - o How will departments be notified?
 - This will be determined once the committee knows whether or not this change must be approved by the Faculty Senate. Departments can reapply to the BC as desired.
- Departments must select one category and this needs to be done by May 1.
- What will the process be?
 - If the committee removes all courses currently dual listed, the list needs to be sent to Belinda and the Office of the Registrar by May 1 so they can update Banner designators. Belinda will create the record in CIM.
- Will the committee annually review the list moving forward?
- Standing Rules Revisions
 - Remove the specific titles from #4 under Course Selection to account for future changes and allow it to be inclusive.
 - The committee moved to approve the changes, seconded; approved with no abstentions.
